TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Reign of God comes about because people commit to reversing their lives completely, to embracing new vision, new values. Many popular television shows exploit an unattractive side of human nature by pitting contestants against one another, even to the point of performing dangerous stunts or devious schemes, to gain money or favor.

At the liturgy, we counter that impulse by committing ourselves to live generously. In response to Christ's total gift, we offer bread and wine as the emblems of our lives, our hopes, our joys and sorrows. ***The bread and wine carried to the altar contain our lives, and by offering our lives to God, we prepare to receive the gift of God's own life. We are to become what we receive: the body of Christ.***

On Sundays, this self giving is often accompanied by a collection and procession of gifts for the poor and money for the upkeep of the parish. There are certainly other methods of collecting money, some perhaps more efficient. ***Yet the act of giving from our abundance, and attending to the needs of the poor, opens us up to participation in the changes the Reign of God requires.***

Music Ministry Corner

Organ!

For those of you attending the Masses on January 19-20, you heard the organ played for the first time in a long time. It was also the first time our piano accompanist Li-Hsin (Lee-shen) played an organ.

("Ooh, the power!" he said when he first played it.)

Well Li-Hsin is no organist but pulled it off beautiful for two reasons: he is an excellent pianist and he had a little help from the organ.

An organist is trained to play bass notes with their feet



(on the "pedals"), low to mid harmonies on the lower keyboard (the "swell") and melodic passages on the upper keyboard (the "great"). (Some organs have four

upper keyboards!) Each keyboard can be configured with different sounds for an overall full effect.

Our organ has a couple of buttons that allow a pianist to play pedal, swell and great on one keyboard, the swell. One button takes the lowest note and plays it on the pedal, another button takes the highest note and play it on the great. And poof! A

pianist sounds like an organist.

Of course it's not as easy as that. The touch is completely different. Notes on a piano can ring out even after you lift your fingers. On organ, lift your fingers and the sound stops. Then there's the art of mixing "stops" - the sounds that add together to create the character of each keyboard so they are distinct and compliment each other.

Remembering Fr. John Coleman

You probably noticed Coleman Hall but maybe you didn't notice the inscription on the organ. "This organ is dedicated to Fr. John Coleman (1919-2008) who loves music dearly. Purchased 5/2/09 with funds Fr. Coleman left for us."

No matter how many verses the closing song had, Fr. Coleman wouldn't process out until the last verse.
