As we do each year, we're providing you our annual financial report for the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2021. Through everyone's generosity, we were able to finish the year over our budget for Sunday giving. Thank you so much!!

Our ability to meet the needs of our amazing parish is primarily determined by Sunday contributions. That is the main source of income for our operating budget used to pay program expenses, fair salaries to our staff, and the



same general costs you experience like utility costs, insurance, and repair expenses. Our operating budget also funds the ways we help neighbors in need.

With your giving, the PPP loan forgiven, and some cost-saving measures, we were able to finish the fiscal year with an overall surplus.

We certainly appreciate your continued support of our amazing parish during these times when many are without work or have reduced income.

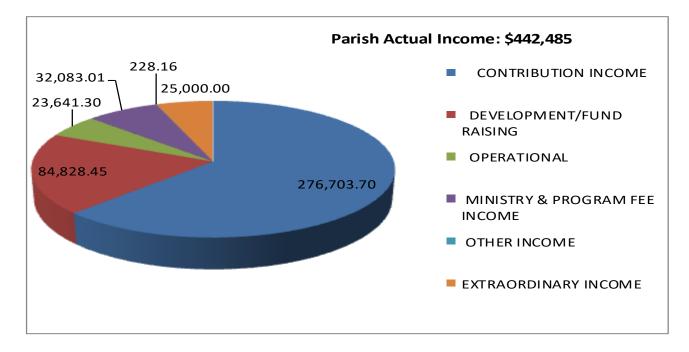
Finally, please know of our continued prayers for all who are suffering from the many impacts of Covid19 and other illnesses.

Income DID Cover Expenses for 2020-2021

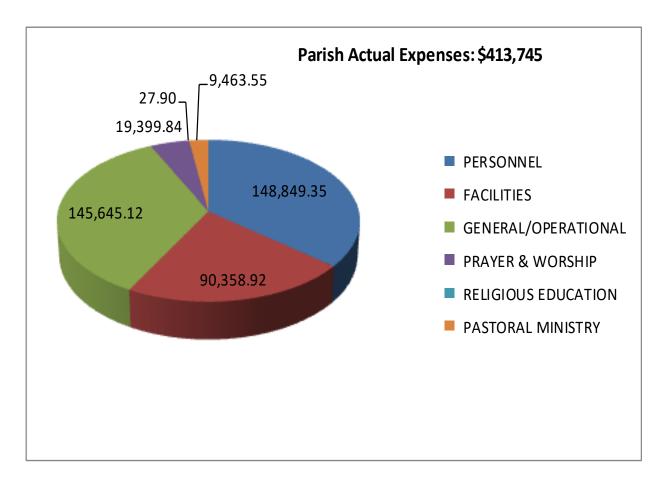
- A 'surplus' year (income exceeded expenses by \$28,740). Overall a good year!

ORDINARY PARISH EXPENSES (2020-2021 Actual)



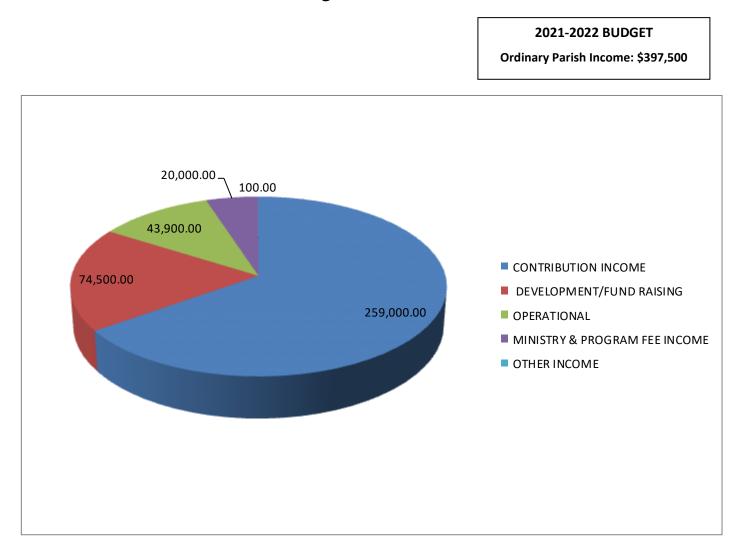

We are projecting an income for next year of \$397,500. This represents a decrease of \$16,245 from last year. Overall, we believe that our yearly income will stabilize somewhere between \$385,000 and \$400,000 for the next few years. The chart below shows the main sources of the remaining income.



Again, most of our income will come from the weekly envelopes and collection plate (66% of the total).

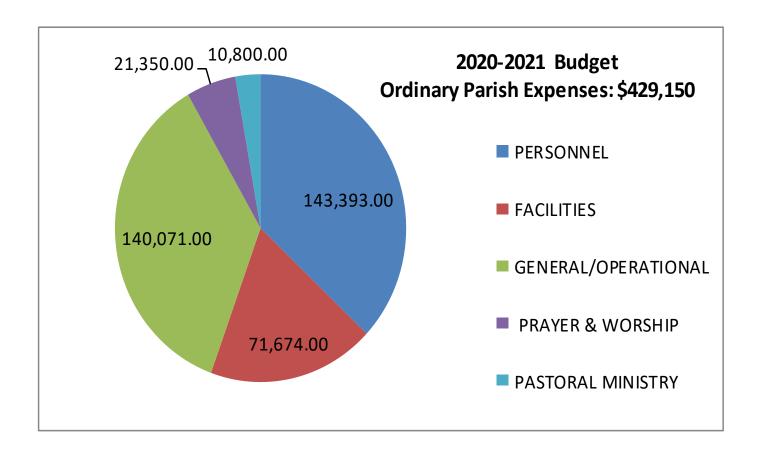
