St. Catherine of Siena, pray for us!



















## A story only God can fully tell

1980	Fr. Thomas Ward 1979-88	1981 A plan to consolidate schools from surrounding parishes is formed, incorporating Coronation of Our Lady and St. Matthew the Apostle, and later, St. Sahina, into the newly named Our Lady of Peace school
